At the County Assizes on 25 October 1611 Richard Dais, a labourer of **Coopersale**, pleaded not guilty to stealing two black cows each worth 53s 4d., belonging to Wm. Putt. He was found guilty and sentenced to be branded. The witness was William Fote.

Fred Brown

It is with great regret that we report the sad death of Fred Brown, a regular contributor to our columns and Vice-President of The Coopersale Horticultural Society.

Fred was a keen and knowledgeable gardener who was always ready to offer advice, either individually or in his regular articles in The Coopersale Chronicle. His gardening column contained hints on how to deal with most common pests, but he admitted being unable to offer advice for dealing with "*the biggest garden pest of the lot*" – cats!

He was a nationally qualified judge and for many years organised the Coopersale Horticultural Society Autumn Show at which the Fred Brown Trophy is presented to the winner of most points in the Miscellaneous Flower Class.

A keen local historian, Fred wrote several books and articles on local history, some of which have appeared in previous issues of the Chronicle. He will be sadly missed and our sympathies go to his widow, Winnie, and daughters Gwen and Linda.
